# LIFELONG CHRISTIAN FORMATION, YOUTH, COLLEGE CAMPUS AND YOUTH ADULT MINISTRIES

2020 has been quite a year in the life of Christian Formation Ministries in the Diocese of East Carolina. Through a global pandemic, racial unrest, and a harried political season, communities have continued to gather in new and different ways, still seeking to serve Christ in all persons.

#### **Lifelong Christian Formation**

Though not officially a department for the entire year, this area of ministry has been growing over time. In October of 2020 the current Program Officer for Youth, College Campus and Young Adult Ministries transition to be the Missioner for Lifelong Christian Formation.

Under the umbrella of Lifelong Christian Formation fall five ages groups for ministry: children, youth, young adults, adults, and older adults. As this ministry area grows there will be more resources an offerings available to all age groups but in particular for those in parishes who facilitate these ministries.

Beginning in early April as the pandemic began to settle in, Formation Leader Gatherings began to be hosted on Zoom. The typically monthly gatherings are available during an afternoon time slot and an evening time slot so as to meet ministry leaders at a time convenient to them. The Diocese has a number of parishes with paid Christian Formation Staff members as well as a number of parishes who rely on volunteer or vestry support for these ministries.

These gatherings will continue online throughout the pandemic, and as restrictions begin to ease, both online and in person options may be offered.

### Space for Grace

Late October through early December a 4 part series focused on learning and pastoral support was offered by the department. Each series featured an expert presenter in a faith-based context on how to cope or manage relationships in the midst of an ongoing pandemic:
